NEW Sensory Story Time with Ms. Linda. Join us for a story time designed for children of all ages with differing abilities, their siblings, parents and caregivers.

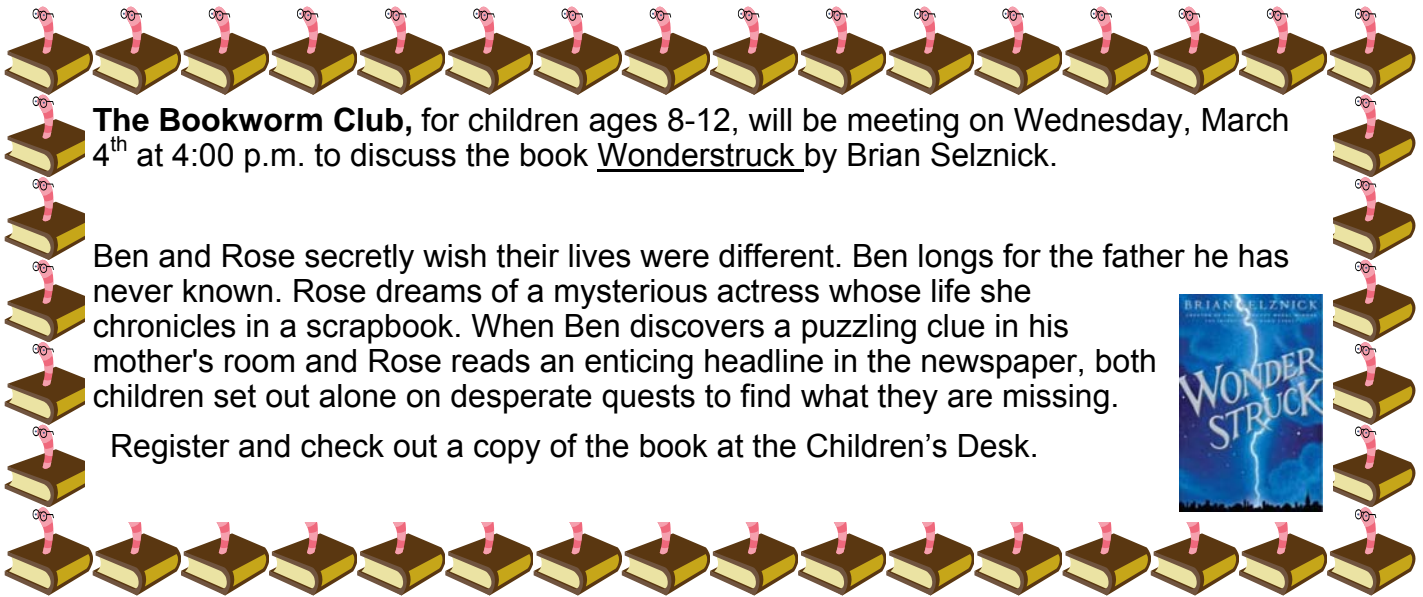



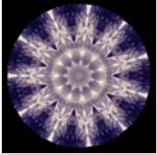
