Kindermusik

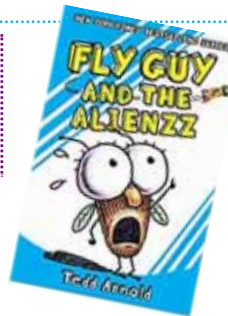

Jumbo Game Night

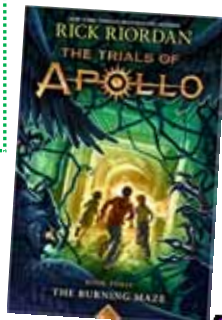

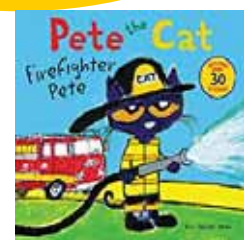
