From the Director:

Update on Library Funding

Libraries are the most popular public service in Ohio. More than 8.9 million Ohioans are public library card holders - that's more than three-fourths of Ohio's population. Public libraries play an essential role in the community, improve the quality of life, and give everyone a chance to succeed.

At the Canal Fulton Public Library, we are very appreciative of the financial support that we receive through state funding, our local levies, grants, and the generous donations from our patrons. We would not be able to serve all of our customers at the current level without your generous support.

I want to make you aware of the funding situation for public libraries in Ohio. Currently, public libraries receive state funding through the Public Library Fund (PLF), which is a percentage of the state General Revenue Fund (GRF). In 2008, the PLF was set at 2.22% of the GRF, but that amount has been cut, frozen, and recalculated several times since then, and is now down to 1.66% of the GRF. This puts our funding from the state at the same level it was in 1996 – *eighteen years ago*. In real dollars, state funding for Ohio's public libraries has been cut by more than \$105 million dollars since 2008.

Last month's statewide distribution to public libraries is about 5% less than the September 2013 distribution. Year to date, the total distribution is about 4% less than 2013.

The Ohio Library Council (OLC) is working with Ohio libraries to help restore our funding. Libraries have always been good stewards of public dollars. We feel it is time that the citizens of Ohio and their communities have their library funding restored. We will be working with the OLC during the next several months - as the state's Fiscal Year 2016-17 budget is introduced and enacted - to restore state funding for Ohio's public libraries back to 2.22% of the GRF. I will keep you posted with updates as we work through this process.

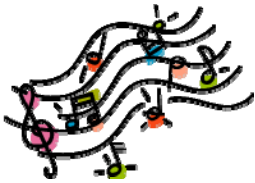
Nights are stretching long and dark

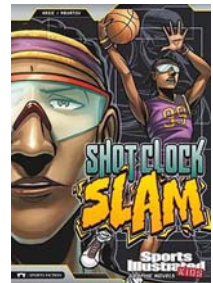
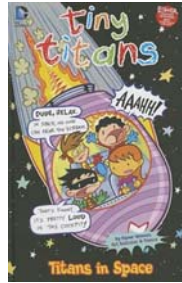

stop by the Reference Desk. *In 1919, Vivien Lowe still hunts for a lover lost in the Great San*

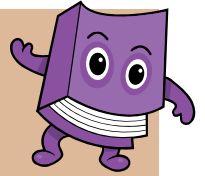
