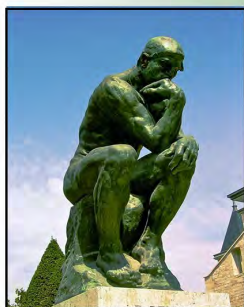

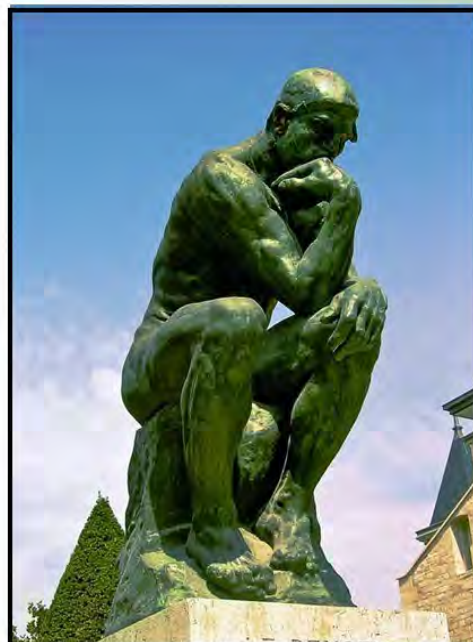

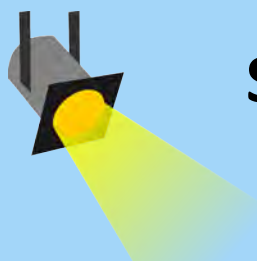

New Team Member: Xerox Copier

You may have noticed a new piece of office equipment if you have stopped by the library lately to print or make copies. We recently added a new Xerox copier along the wall opposite the Circulation Department desk. This new Xerox prints in black and white, and also in color. It also has both scanning and faxing capabilities. And the best part? **Faxing is now free at the library!** That's right, there is no longer a charge to fax documents when you fax materials from our machine.

The new machine will still charge 15 cents a page to print/copy in black and white, and 50 cents per page to print/copy in color. Don't have any cash? Not a problem!

The new copier now accepts credit cards and other electronic forms of payment like Apple Pay.
