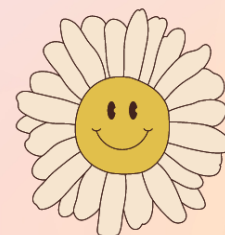
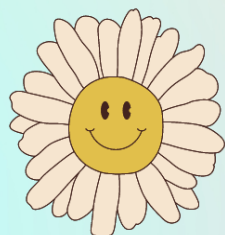
Tots and Tales Story Time | ages birth- 2

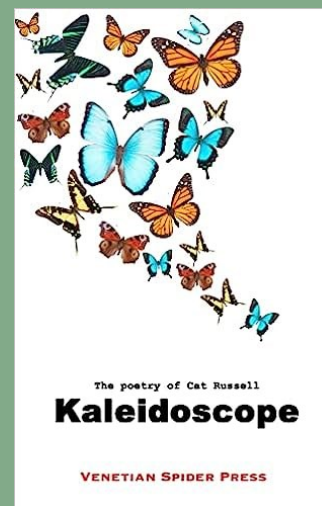

Local History



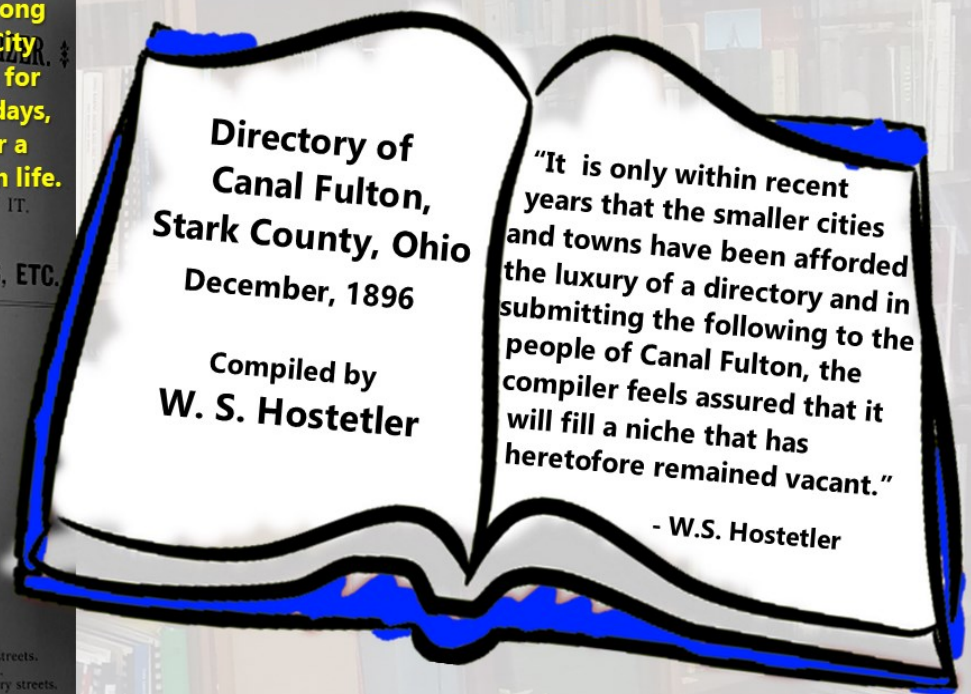
The Canal Fulton Public Library was recently awarded a \$2,500 grant from the Ohio Historical Records Advisory Board (OHRAB) to hire a consultant to advise us with implementing archival best practices through an assessment of the library's local history/genealogy program, and to develop a phased strategic growth plan to preserve, organize, access, and promote the collections for use by the public. The plan also included a development strategy for partnering with the Canal Fulton Heritage Society, whose collections are similar in scope, mission, and vision, and to share resources and amplify their impact on a local and regional level.

The historical significance of the materials varies from photos documenting the Ohio and Erie Canalway in Canal Fulton and Clinton, to library history of the CFPL building, programs, patrons, and staff. Some of the canal photos have been reproduced in publications. The library history photos and documents are one of a kind records of the years 1939 to present.

An historic preservation consultant recently reviewed our existing documentation, policies, procedures, reports, inventory lists, finding aids, and reference service for the library and heritage center. The consultant assessed the physical collections and public service areas of the library's local history and heritage society's collections to provide recommendations for preservation, physical storage, collection organization, and public service programs. Resources, training, and best practices were identified for improvement.

This project is supported in part by an award from the Ohio Historical Records Advisory Board, through funding from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC), National Archives and Records Administration.

Library Director David Brown Retires June 30th



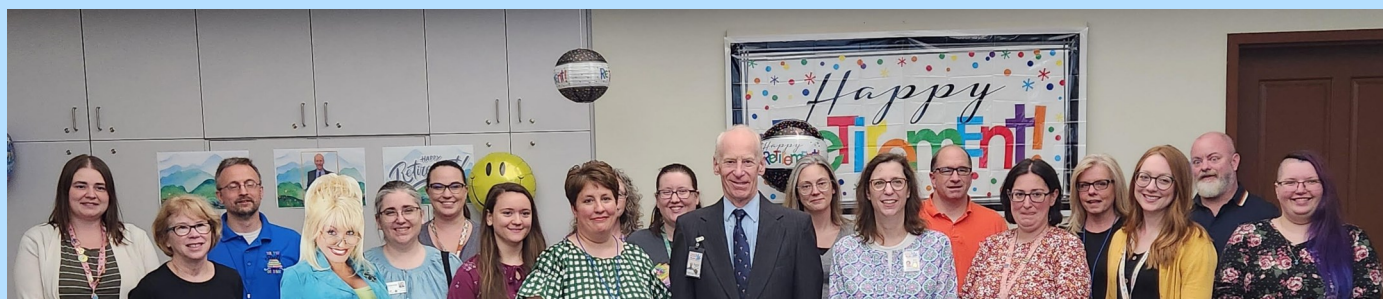

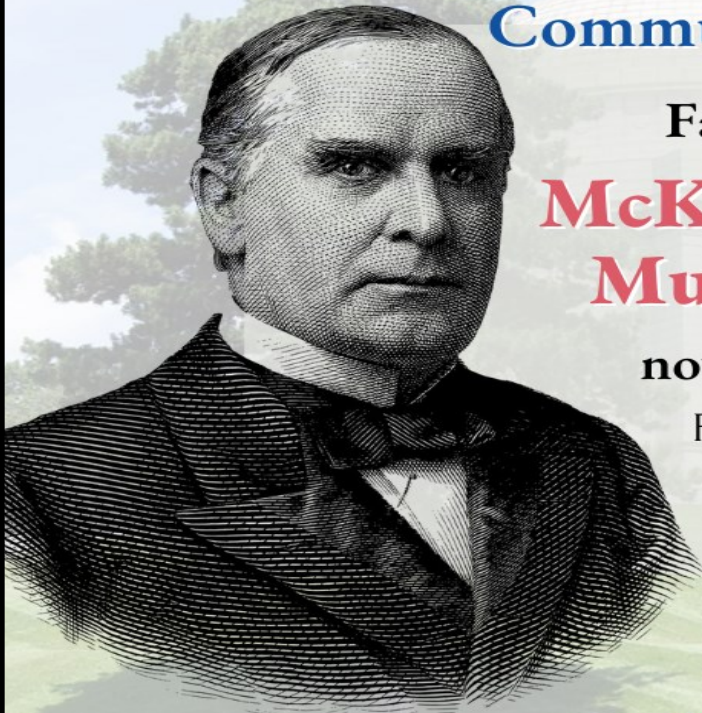
